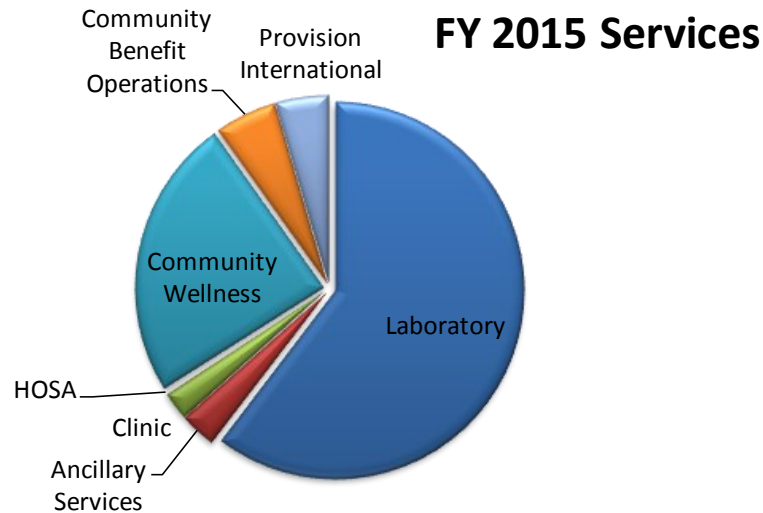

1 Laboratory- \$151,048

In 2015, 386 people took advantage of the \$50 Birthday Lab special with 96 men adding on the PSA service for an additional \$50.

2 Ancillary Services -\$7,735

Informational materials promoting Mammograms and Breast Health as well as informational materials for Bone Health Awareness. As well as a PT equipment loaner program.

3 Clinic-\$6,000

Free blood pressure checks, prescription assistance programs, sample medications, pre-authorization with insurance carriers for prescriptions, Coumadin compliance program, presumptive eligibility assessments, flu and pneumonia shot clinics were provided to patients.

4 HOSA- Health Occupations Students of America -\$487

To promote healthcare, we pair up with Cut Bank High School and the students who have chosen to participate in Health Occupations of America. These students participated in hands on labs with hospital staff guidance. This is done to promote health care careers.

5 Community Wellness -\$60,328

Community based health education classes, Community health fair, Support programs, partnered with schools to promote wellness.

6 Community Benefit Operations \$13,361

Contributions to organizations and programs that benefit and support community programs, like Toys for Tots with 200 children provided for and Relay for Life.

7 Provision International \$11,281

Northern Rockies Medical Center donated out dated equipment and supplies to less fortunate countries.

NRMC'S Local Economic Impact in Our Community in Fiscal Year 2015

Northern Rockies Medical Center is a locally governed, non-profit healthcare system that has been part of the Cut Bank community for more than 13 years providing care, healing, and health.

Supporting our local economy is an important part of our community

Capital Investments: \$124,000

NRMC invested \$124,000 in equipment purchases to enhance our services in the community.

Payroll: \$4,189,000

Our employees, physicians and their families have developed roots in our service area and support our local economy.

Locally Purchased Supplies and Services: \$768,000

Hospitals need many supplies to provide health care.

When possible, NRMC looks to local and state suppliers when purchasing medical equipment, food, and services.

Community Wellness

• Health Fair

Held in the fall of 2015, Northern Rockies Medical Center sponsored a Health Fair in the community which included 45 vendors promoting health and wellness. It featured a run/walk encompassing the city to encourage people to move. NRMC wanted to bring awareness to the importance of preventative medical screenings (i.e. EKG's, mammograms, and annual lab work), diet, and exercise.

• Worksite Wellness

Partnered with Cut Bank Schools to help promote wellness among the teachers and staff. This 12 week project consisted of collecting baseline information, surveying health and wellness interests, and implementation of exercise, nutrition, and wellness plans customized to the needs of the individual. The reassessment will be completed on the anniversary date of the project.

• Community Wellness

Provided classes to the community promoting exercise and healthy lifestyles to a variety of age groups ranging from early 20s to late 80s. Feedback from the Community Health Needs assessment showed demand for access to exercise and diet/nutrition classes. In response to these requests, NRMC encouraged local individuals to obtain personal training and health coach certifications to serve the community.

• Community Health Needs

Worked with community leaders to create a Community Coalition to focus on promoting wellness in our area.

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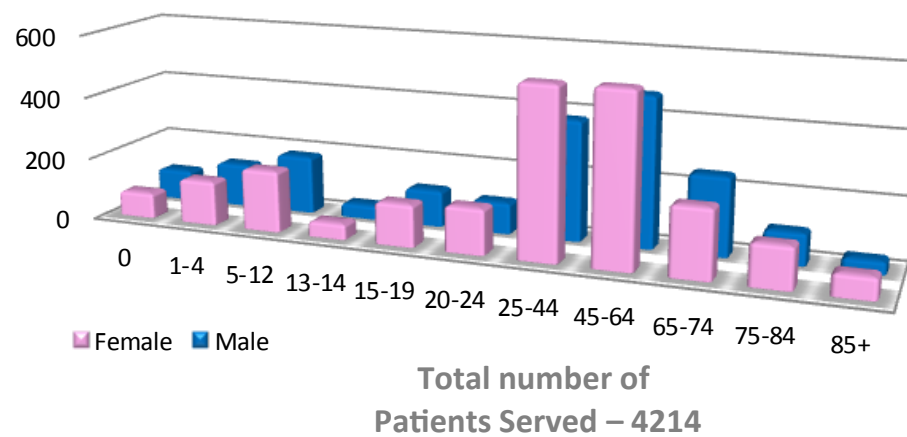

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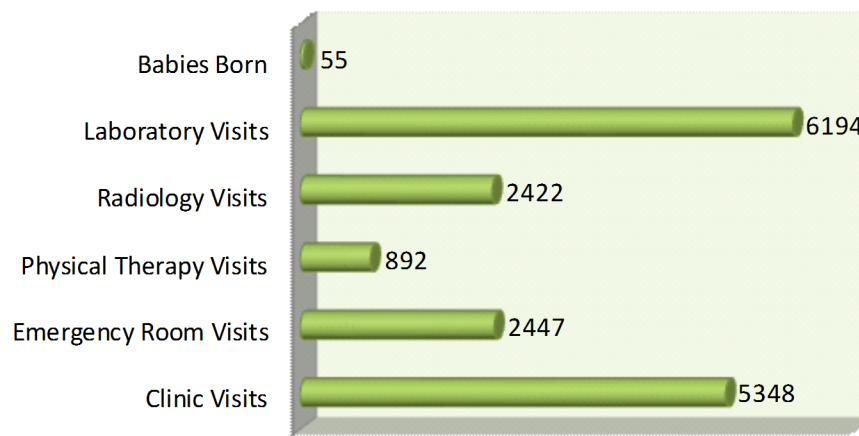
