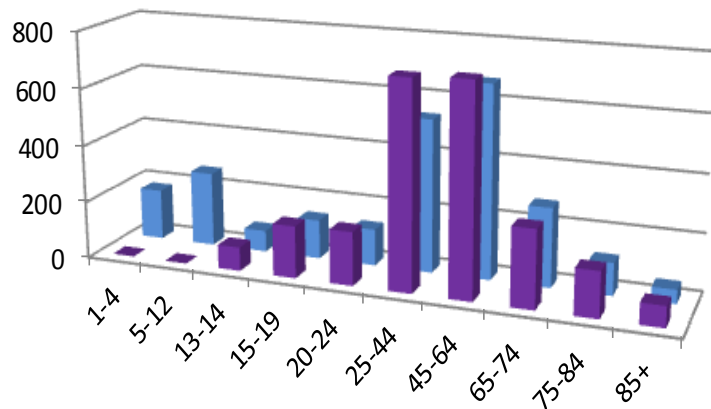

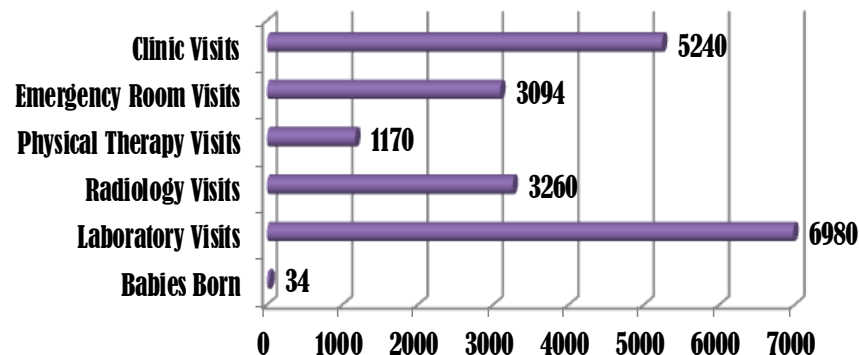

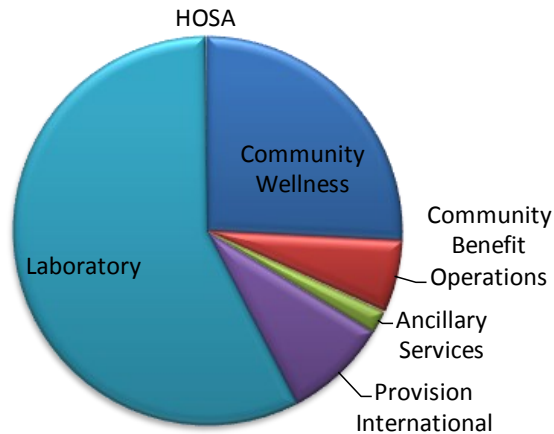

- 1 **Laboratory- \$132,966**  
426 patients took advantage of the birthday Lab special for \$50 and 97 patients took advantage of the PSA special for \$50.
- 2 **Ancillary- \$4,376**  
Informational materials promoting Mammograms and Breast Health as well as informational materials for Bone Health Awareness
- 3 **Clinic-\$5,600**  
Free blood pressure checks, prescription assistance programs, sample medications, pre-authorization with insurance carriers for prescriptions, Coumadin compliance program, presumptive eligibility assessments, flu and pneumonia shot clinics were provided to patients.
- 4 **HOSA- Health Occupations Students of America -\$470**  
Students from Cut Bank High School participated in Health Occupations of America. Students observed many areas of the hospital; Lab, Radiology, Physical Therapy, Nursing, Pharmacy and Health and Wellness. Each department offered information as well as hands on activities for the students to participate in. This is done to promote health care careers.
- 5 **Community Wellness -\$59,736**  
Community based health education classes, community health fair, support programs, and partnered with schools to promote wellness.
- 6 **Community Benefit Operations \$13,836**  
Contributions to organizations and programs that benefit and support community programs, such as Toys for Tots with 200 children provided for and Relay for Life
- 7 **Provision International \$20,196**  
Northern Rockies Medical Center donated outdated equipment and supplies to less fortunate countries.

# NRMC'S Local Economic Impact in Our Community in Fiscal Year 2016

Northern Rockies Medical Center is a locally governed, non-profit healthcare system that has been part of the Cut Bank community for more than 15 years providing care, healing, and health. Supporting our local economy is an important part of our community commitment.

## Capital Investments: \$384,000

NRMC invested in recreating the OB Department at the facility. It used the funds to renovate the OB rooms to help enhance the services offered at NRMC.

## Payroll: \$4,405,000

Our employees, physicians and their families are also members of the community and have developed roots in our service area and support our local economy.

## Locally Purchased Supplies and Services: \$1,041,000

Hospitals need many supplies to provide health care. When possible, NRMC looks to local and state suppliers when purchasing medical equipment, food, and services.

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## Community Wellness

### • Health Fair

Held in the fall of 2016, Northern Rockies Medical Center sponsored a Health Fair in the community which included 45 vendors promoting health and wellness. NRMC wanted to bring awareness to the importance of preventative medical screenings (i.e. EKG's, mammograms, bone density testing, diabetic education and annual lab work), diet, and exercise. As well as having a variety of community members speaking on health and wellness.

### • Worksite Wellness

Partnered with Cut Bank Schools to help promote wellness among the teachers and staff. This 12 week project consisted of collecting baseline information, surveying health and wellness interests, and implementation of exercise, nutrition, and wellness plans customized to the needs of the individual. The reassessment will be completed on the anniversary date of the project.

### • Community Wellness

Provided classes to the community promoting exercise and healthy lifestyles to a variety of age groups ranging from early 20s to late 80s. Feedback from the Community Health Needs assessment showed demand for access to exercise and diet/nutrition classes. In response to these requests, NRMC encouraged local individuals to obtain personal training and health coach certifications to serve the community.

### • Community Health Needs

Worked with community leaders to create a Community Coalition to focus on promoting wellness in our area.
